The purpose of this memorandum is to provide information relating to recent amendments to Section 100.5(d-C /P < ET Ep-

61 on the Regents Exam in English for ELLs otherwise eligible to graduate in January 2015 and thereafter who:

- o have received academic intervention services in English language arts,
- o have an attendance rate of at least 95 percent for the school year during which the student last took the Regents examination in English,
- o have attained a course averag Einglish Language Arts that meets or exceeds the required SDVVLQJJUDGH E∖ WKH VFKRRO DQG LV UHFRUGHG RQ WK achieved by the student in each quarter of the schoolaynedar,
- o are recommended for an exemption to the spirag score on the Regents examination by his or her teacher or department chairperiso English Language As.

These amendments will allow ELLs who meet the above requirements, and who score between 55 61¹ on the Regents Exam in English after two appear attaining a score of 65 or above, to receive a local diploma via appeal if they

- o successfully appeal the Regents examination in Englishscore at least 65 on each of the four remaining required Regents examinations (or satisfy the correspondingation requirement via an available alternative pathway),
- o successfully appeal the Regents examination in Englisescore at least 65 on three other required Regents examinations (or satisfy the corresponding graduation requirement via an

availablealternative pathway and score between 62 to 64 on one other required Regents examination and successfully appeal that exam.

These amendments will help reduce the gap in graduation rates between ELLs-**EndLsndn** June 2013, only 31.4% of ELLs graded, compared to 74.9% of nertlls. With the availability of this graduation option, laterriving ELLs who are able to pass other required Regents examinations with a score of 65 and who obtain a score of at least 55 on the Regents examination incEnglish benefit from the opportunity to obtain postsecondary education or enter a career in the same manner as other students who may earn a diploma through the appeal process. ELLs will also remain eligible for the current appeals process, and the committee eviews other Regents appeals will also review appeals under these amendments.
